## **New Performance Venue for Derby!**



As of one of its 50 Pledges to take Derby forwards, Derby City Council is developing a 3,000 seat Performance Venue to replace the 40-year old Assembly Rooms in the city centre. You will be able to access quality events just 30 minutes away from you!

We expect a planning application to be submitted in 2019, demolition and construction to occur in 2020 with a planned opening date of 2022. We will then have a modern and attractive venue to bring the best entertainment for local residents to enjoy all year round!

## **New Moorways Swimming Pool – contractor appointed**



Derby's new swimming pool complex has taken a significant step forward after being granted planning permission and Derbyshire construction firm Bowmer and Kirkland appointed to build it. The approved plans include a 50 metres ten lane pool, learner pool, leisure water, sauna and steam, gym, exercise studios, childrens soft play and multi-use rooms. Construction is planned to start on the Moorways site later this year with the complex scheduled to open in 2020. The New Swimming Pool is one of the Council's 50 Pledges. ## **Big Build Project – refurbished Community Centre**

Have you seen the TV shows 'DIY SOS' and the 'BIG Build'? Well the community now has its own BIG Build! The #allentonBIGbuild is taking place at St Martins Church and Community Centre on Flint Street, near the Allenton Shopping Centre, and involves a full refurbishment of the Community Centre plus an amazing new extension with a new Community Café. This exciting project will make a huge difference for local residents.

It is the result of years of hard work by local people and partners in securing funding and planning but what is really special is that over 80% of the work is being completed at no cost to the project. I also did my bit to help out.







Local businesses, suppliers and contractors have all generously donated towards the project with many supplying goods or services heavily discounted or even for FREE! Plus local young people from Derby College and Juniper Training Academy also carry out work as part of their learning experience.

Once completed St Martins Community Centre will offer all local residents; a New Community Café, STEPS Project – an adult learning project for those with learning disabilities, a new mental health support project, a modern venue for parties, events and activities, plus a fantastic new community garden in addition to a number of existing services. There are also lots of other ideas in the pipeline, and local people are being encouraged to get in touch with their ideas for projects or activities.

Derby City Council and Derby Homes work closely with the project team and as your local councillor I have continued to support St Martins Church with this ambitious project. So watch this space, completion is due in the next few months and there will be a grand opening event.

## **Great British Spring Clean**

The 2<sup>nd</sup> – 4<sup>th</sup> March was the National Great British Spring Clean weekend, however we decided to deliver activities over a longer period in Boulton. As part of our commitment for the community we represent to be a clean city, we held a Compactor day and collected 6 tonnes of waste – residents were very grateful for the service.
